General Session IV: RCMI Consortium Program Evaluation

Overarching Goal: The primary goal of the RCMI Coordinating Center's Evaluation is to assess increased scientific and community collaborations, scientific productivity, development of new and early-stage investigators, and engagement of diverse group of scientists in mitigating health disparities.

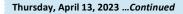
